


# Long Island Woodturner's Association

## **AUGUST DEMONSTRATION**

The August demonstration began with Bill Holland turning a cedar blank to an exaggerated hour glass shape that would eventually be formed into a three legged stand. Bill gave an easily understandable explanation and demonstration of the set up needed to true the blank. After the blank was trued , he turned the piece into two bowl shapes which the larger end would yield three legs for the stand.

Although time did not permit for the base to be but into three legs, Bill had a completed base sawed and ready to decorate for the members.





Peter Richichi followed Bill with a demonstration of burning techniques using a Detail Master too. The legs were decorated on the outside. Members had the opportunity to try their hand with the Detail Master burning to.

Ken Deaner then discussed and demonstration various methods of applying colorants to a surface by brush, airbrush, and coloring sticks. Ken used different mediums, sealers and waxes to mask off an area to be colored. Various types of paints were discussed to give the observer an overall acquaintance to the products available.

Thanks to Bill, Peter and Ken for an enlightening look into the methods for creating a decorated three legged ornament stand.

**DIRECTIONS TO THE EXOTIC WOOD GROUP WAREHOUSE FROM  
JERICHO TURNPIKE/LARKFIELD ROAD, EAST NORTHPORT:**

- 1) From the intersection of Jericho Turnpike & Larkfield Road, head North on Larkfield Road (Home Depot will be immediately on your right); stay on Larkfield Road for about 3 miles
- 2) Cross over LIRR tracks and bear left at fork onto Laurel Road (stay on for about 0.4 miles; you'll pass by a cemetery)
- 3) Turn right at the Laurel Shopping Center at **192 Laurel Road**
- 4) Park anywhere in the parking lot. We're located down the ramp at the very end of the parking lot (underneath the Northport Dance studio).
