December Demonstrator Don Lindsley

Club member Don Lindsley demonstrated the use of three different coring systems.



During each coring demonstration, Don included key points about each coring tool. Before purchasing any one of these systems, it is important to "test drive" several and determine which system suits your needs.



Woodcut

"Easy to use"
Good for lathes 12" or smaller
Approx \$275
Alignment is critical for a successful cut

Oneway

About \$500
Comes with 4 different blades
User friendly
Oneway system allows tailstock to be brought up to the blank
Care must be taken not to bend knives.
Banjo needs to be adjusted often.

McNaughton

Select knives that will fit the desired blank.
Cutting tips are welded
Sharpening can be done with a diamond card
Mike Mahoney's video on this system is very
helpful.
Mahoney suggests that widening the kerf is very
helpful to prevent binding.
Align tip of the cutting blade right of the center
line before starting the coring cut.
Lots of torque created with this sytem.

Sighting down the cutting tip is helpful with beginning the cut.
Cutting tip should be lubricated to prevent binding.

Placement of the cutting tip is by eye.


