

LYLE JAMIESON WORKSHOPS

Lyle Jamieson will be demonstrating and teaching workshops in our area the last week of March, 2009. He is available for one-on-one hands-on sessions in your shop, with your tools, at your skill level.

Although he is very well known for his hollow form turning with his supported boring bar and laser measuring system, he also teaches foundations classes, concentrating on tool control, preventing catches, sharpening and grain orientation issues. Good tool control means you can start sanding with 320 grit sandpaper. It's all about the FUN; turning is not hard work anymore!

February Demonstration Don Lindsley

Don demonstrated his techniques for inlaying minerals in a woodturning.

Don showed how to crush larger mineral pieces using a mortar and pestle. Finely crushed minerals can be purchased from <u>Gemport</u>, a mineral supply company located on Route 25A in Northport, NY. (631-261-8028), and from the <u>Woodturners</u> and <u>Packard's</u> catalogs.

Don filled openings and small fissures in a roughly turned bowl with colored minerals and CA glue. The mixture was allowed to harden and then returned to a smooth finish. Don mentioned that many voids, imperfections or checks can be accentuated by adding a colorful mineral inlay.







Don also turned a set of multi-axis salad tongs.







The blank for the tongs was constructed by gluing two equally sized pieces of wood with a sheet of paper between them. The tongs are turned using three different axes. After the tongs are turned to shape, the two blank is split apart carefully with a hammer and chisel.

The bowl section of each tong needs to be carved to achieve the proper shape for use.
