

Make right onto Rt. 25. (East) to first light and then turn left onto Meadow Rd. (before RR tracks).

Take Meadow Rd. to first light and bear left onto Gardiner Rd. Bob's house is on the right approx. one-eighth of a mile. (Caleb Smith Park will be on the left side of Gardiner Rd.)
