

## **September Demonstration**

Martin Rost conducted an informative discussion and demonstration on finishing. Martin explained the distinctions between and uses of several finishes such as paraffin, beeswax, carnuba, and paste wax.

Oil based finishes were included in the discussion. Non-drying oils such as mineral and various vegetable oils and drying or semi-drying oils such as boiled linseed, walnut and tung were explained as to their properties, general application and uses.



Martin emphasized that several considerations should be thought about when choosing a finish. These are:

- -cost of finishing product
- -viscosity of finish-allows easier application in some cases
- -amount of gloss/satin patina desired
- -porosity of wood used-denser woods absorb less, more porous wood will absorb thinner finish more readily
- -personable preference
- -future use of turning-will it be handled often or placed on a shelf, or contact with food

The **Lathe Committee** has researched the best price for our new Powermatic lathe. The Olsenik Company's price is \$2,400 for model 3520A, which includes free shipping.

Powermatic has produced a newer version of this lathe, the 3520B that is approximately \$ 2,700.

A unanimous vote was taken to authorize the Lathe Committee to purchase the 3520B model if it is decided that the newer model would be worth the extra expense.

#### My First Demonstration

My first demo seemed to go well, and I appreciated all the questions, as that allowed me to focus in on what people were interested in. After I finished I realized that were some things I wanted to tell, but had forgotten.

The first involves waxes; the paraffin, bee's wax, and carnauba can be melted together in various proportions to get a blend of their individual properties.

Some of you noticed that there was a layer at the bottom of the friction polish. The polish will separate and needs a little shake before using.

Another item that I wanted to talk about was resources. As far as I know, there are no books dedicated to finishing turnings. There are many general finishing books, the one probably most often mentioned is Understanding Wood Finishing, by Bob Flexner. Besides Flexner, Michael Dresdner and Jeff Jewitt have written books on finishing. In addition Dresdner has a web site. www.michaeldresdner.com, where you can find finishing hints, and a list of his books. Also on the Internet is Russ Fairfield on Wood Central. Russ is a turner who has written a series of essays on finishing turnings. Russ has different methods and recommendations than I do, but I did tell you that finishing does involve plenty of personal biases and preferences.
