Mid Monthly Meeting

The Mid-monthly meeting was held Tuesday, March 7,2006 at Bob Brady's house in Dix Hills. Members brought an unfinished piece with no identifying marks. Each piece was critiqued on its merits by the Club members present.

Methods and application of various finishing products were discussed.

The group experimented with drying several newly turned green wood bowls. Each bowl was weighed and put in the microwave at one-half power for two minutes. It was placed outside to cool while another bowl was similarly treated. After each time in the oven, the bowls were then weighed again to determine the amount of water that was lost.

Bob and Ken Deaner calculated that over ten per cent of the total weight of each green bowl was reduced by the ten total minutes that each bowl was subjected to the oven.

One must be careful though, as too much heating could result in a bowl cracking or distorting so much that to retrue the bowl would prove fruitless.

February Demonstration

Club member **Bob Kaplan** served as our demonstrator for the February 11, 2006 meeting. Bob showed his techniques for turning a long stemmed goblet.

Bob began by using an 18" long blank of maple. Bob worked between centers first drilling out the end of the piece to allow for hollowing out the cup later. He then proceeded to turn the twelve-inch stem portion of the piece to three-quarter inch thickness. Bob pointed out that this part of the turning process needs patience. A slow steady hand and gentle tool application to the wood is necessary to prevent a break in the stem.

Bob used a spindle steady to turn a thin stem. The steady must be moved along the stem often to allow the gouge to do it's work.

He pointed out that a catch or slight grab could result in a break and render the piece useless.

After the stem was sized to about one-quarter inch, Bob sanded the stem and would then apply any finish at this time.

For demonstration purposes, Bob did not completely hollow the goblet top, as the stem turning demonstration was the main topic for that day. He did, however, stress that all turning,

sanding and finishing must be completely before any work on the stem is started.
