Bill Holland-rosewood and purpleheart goblet

Tiberio Yepes-many layered (180-220) laminated pens

Bob Sesti-natural edged maple burl bowl, jarrah burl vessel w/blackwood finial

Les Hoffman-2 sycamore bowls w/rim, curly maple "raindrop" bowl

Peter Richichi- colored and carved segmented vessel, lidded maple & walnut box, cedar bowl w/ shellac finish

Len Mulqueen-wenge and Australian eucalyptus burl candle holder, samples of laser cut wood

Ken Deaner-hollowed vessel and multi-colored in spiral pattern, carved bowl, square bowl w/textured bottom

Martin Rost-numerous Christmas tree shaped turnings of various sizes, small candlesticks

Carl Saenger-cherry burl w/natural edge and void on the rim,
Large layered plywood vessel constructed with $\frac{3}{4}$ inch cabinet grade plywood

Don Lindsley- 4 cored wild black cherry bowls, 2 cored cherry root bowls

Steve Fulgoni-natural edge walnut bowls treated w/ sodium sulfite to preserve the whiteness of the sapwood.

John Kowalchuk-spalted maple dish, butternut dish

Bob Kaplan-off-center maple goblet turned on two axes with turned ring on the stem

Mike Josiah-maple & wenge segmented vessel

Greg Nicharico-4 acrylic pens
