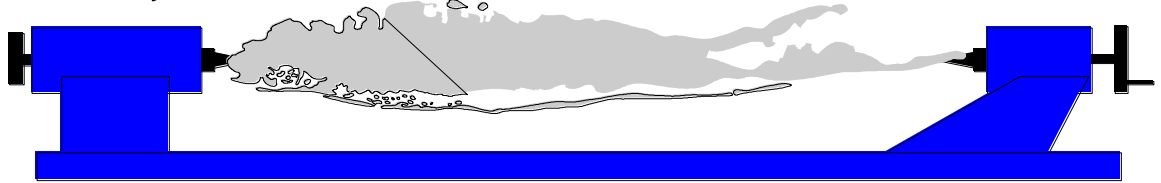

Thoughts and Ideas

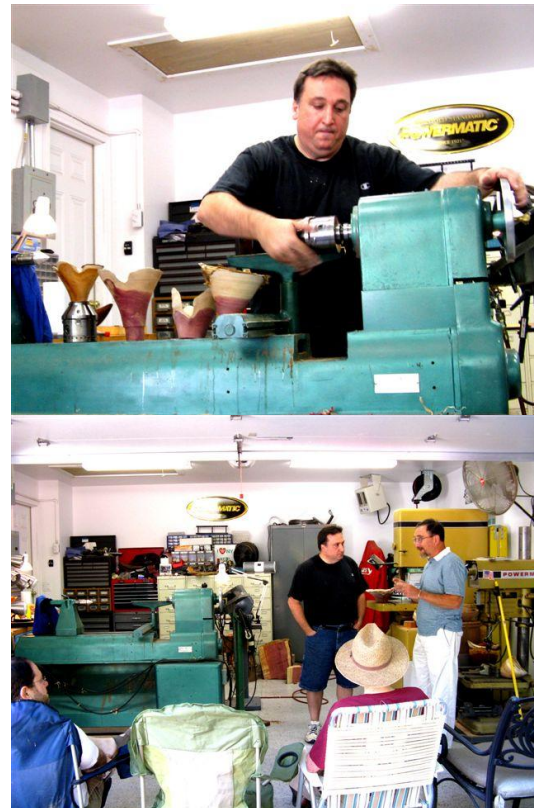
Thanks to our LIWA members for contributions to this Newsletter during the past year.
