December Demonstration Joshua Friend-"Turning a Long Cigar box."

Joshua Friend is a member of The Nutmeg Woodturners Club.

Joshua prefers to use local wood for his turnings.

He began his demonstration by placing a blank of ash 2 ½:" x21/2" x 12" between centers.

Joshua trued the blank to round and created a tenon on both ends.



The blank was mounted in a chuck with the tailstock added for support.

He then parted off the bottom section with a homemade parting tool. The cap section remained in the chuck. The end was cleaned up and made slightly concave.

Joshua then hollowed out the cap with a brad point drill. He prefers to 1/4" wall thickness for both the cap and main sections of the box.

Drilling from the tailstock with a Jacobs chuck, Joshua slows the lathe speed.

The main part was then drilled using a 26-mm.-drill bit dipped in paste wax to ease the hollowing process.

A live center was then placed in the tailstock for support of the hollowed section.



Using a sharp parting tool, the male dimension was sized to fit into the female top section.

After several minimal reduction cuts, the cap is tested as many times as

necessary to achieve a precise "suction" fit between the cap and main sections.

After the fit was made to Joshua's satisfaction, he then shaped the box with small gouges.



To finish the box, Joshua uses an abrasive wax compound. For added detail, he will sometimes burn decorative lines to hide the seam line of the two sections.

The box was well turned, finished and will prove to be a beautiful storage container for a fine cigar.
