Main Event

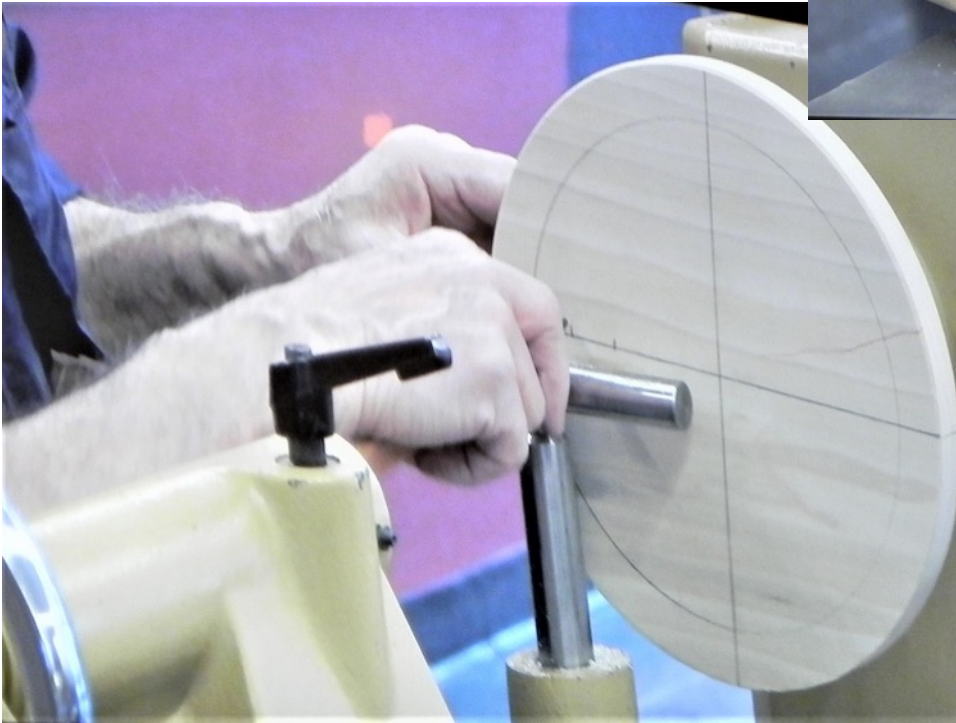
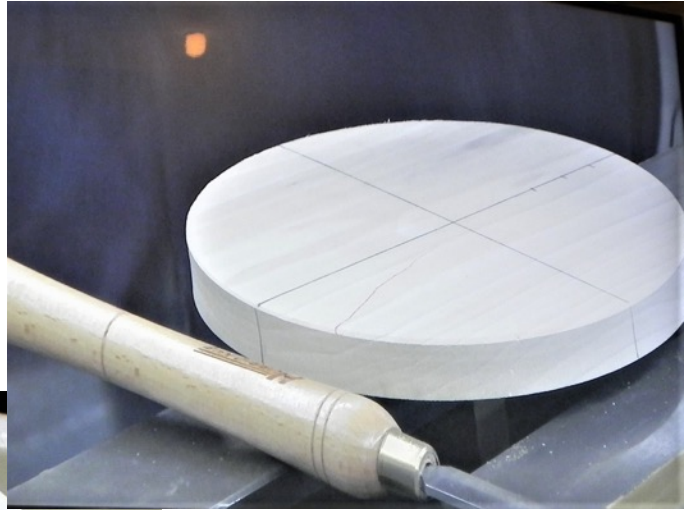
Bowl from a Board



Barry developed this presentation on a recent article in the Wood Turning magazine.

Barry started by mounting a small board on the lathe and turning a 2" tenon. He rounded the outside corners and then took a previously glued up board (~ cutting board) which he made "perfectly flat" and glued the tenon to it.

He suggested that you leave it in clamps for 3 hours. Then mark 4 quadrants on the surface. Place the tenon in a 4-jaw dovetail chuck (for added safety).



Mark concentric circles as shown. Set an angle gauge to 50 degrees and place it on the toolrest to aid in aligning the cutting tool.

Slice the first outer ring from the board, repeat for the other rings.

Align the marks and glue the rings together. When dry remount on the lathe. Turn as you would a standard bowl. Barry turns the outside first using a pull cut. When he works on the inside he uses a bowl gouge then a negative rake scraper (cutting on center). This is followed by sanding, then removing the tenon using cole jaws. Finish is applied to complete the process.
