




















Subject: Links from today's chat on the Lidded Bowl Demo

Another use for a lidded vessel ...

What is 'Beads of Courage' ? See <u>AAW partnership with BOC</u> and info about the guidelines if you wish to adapt Glenn's lidded bowl as a vessel for BOC

TOOL - RED GL4. 5/8in Bowl Gouge. 55 degree

TOOL- GREEN GL5 1/2 inch bar, 45degree

TOOL- BLUE <u>GL 6 – ¾" bar Ø</u> bottom finishing bowl gouge

Screws for faceplate - SPAX screws (Home Depot) and US size 8 or 1 1/4in Vicmarc chuck

TOOL - Diamond point scraper HCT44GL sharpened to 77 degrees

Making beads - this way is with TOOL - GREEN. GL8. 3/8 spindle gouge.

TOOL -GL1s French curve scraper

Wall mounted <u>Dust Extraction arm and hood</u> - on Glenn's online shop - 1M or 2M https://glennlucaswoodturning.com/product/dust-extraction-arm-and-hood-1m-radius/

Sandpaper - 6in velcro based discs that Glenn punches out into 2in or 3in disc.

<u>Sanding pads</u> (to attach to drill and then velcro the sandpaper on to)

Walnut oil will harden/cure. It needs some heat to cure - sunlight or the friction from the sanding - This walnut oil is from Mike Meredith - Doctor's Woodshop Oregon <u>www.doctorswoodshop.com</u>. Or Mike Mahoney walnut oil

- 1. Cover piece with oil on a cloth
- 2. Cloth backed sandpaper start with 120 then to 180 grit then 240 then 320
- 3. Lathe speed 300
- 4. Speed up to 1000 and paper towel buffing the piece also creates heat to help the oil cure
- 5. On Day 2 once the oil has cured, Glenn uses HERMES 500 grit silicon carbide paper on a slow speed (reverse lathe) to get the raised fibres
- 6. Then another coat of oil
