The AAW symposium in Chattanooga, TN was too difficult to get to, but Lancaster is a do-able drive, and there will be many great demonstrators there. Early registration is closed, but there is still time to register. Symposia are a great way to jump-start your woodturning knowledge if you are a new turner, and a source of new ideas for everyone else.
