Paul showed a large planter-type bowl made on his new American Beauty lathe, and a small burl bowl.

Barry produced the surviving 2 sycamore bowls from a 4 bowl coring, a cherry calabash bowl and a gavel and pounding block.

Demo: Steve used a chain saw to show how to cut various logs into turning blanks, indicating where to make the cuts relative to where the pith is and the different ways to make the cuts. As always, it was a master class on how to do a demonstration.
